Smokin' for Charity

The club's BBQ team had another successful holiday BBQ sale on Memorial Day weekend. Additional time was needed to purchase meat up to 2 weeks ahead of the BBQ to make sure all the various meat orders were covered. The pork loins, ribs and the briskets were bought at Costco & H.E.B. due to the lack of inventory, at any one store! We SOLD OUT!

18 briskets - 209.72 lbs. - Avg. weight of 12.73 lbs.
33 racks of ribs - 132.25 lbs. - Avg. weight of 4.00 lbs.
12 - 1/2 pork loins - 58.65 lbs. - Avg. weight of 4.88 lbs.

The results are: \$2,877.00 (sales) - \$1,504 (expenses) = \$1,373.00 (net to the club's charitable account).

There are basically 6 separate stages to providing each BBQ; 1-SHOPPING, 2-SITE SET UP, 3-MEAT PREPARATION, 4-SMOKIN' THE MEAT, 5-CUSTOMER PICK UP & 6-SITE / EQUIP. CLEAN UP. This BBQ had 18 team members working 189 hours involved at various stages of the process.
