

The members of the Lago Vista Lions Club continued their heavy involvement during the extended fall season with many service activities that showcased "WE SERVE" to the community.

The significant activities of the quarter, in addition to the road clean-up, eyeglass collections, and on-going administration of the club, include:

- Serving 800 hot dogs at the National Night Out event on 10/3/23 (10 members, 49 hours).
- The KidSight Team covered four (4) sessions at two elementary, 1 middle, and 1 high school(s) in the Liberty Hill School District during October. The six members of the team spent 110 hours performing this valuable community service.
- The annual Pancake Breakfast was prepared and served at the Jonestown Fire Station on 11/4/23 (22 members, 128 hours).
- LV Lions assisted the Women's Club in serving lunch for the veterans and family members that attended the LV High School Veterans Day Ceremony on 11/10/23 (22 members, 31 hours).
- The demand from the greater Northshore communities for the "Message In A Bottle" product necessitated Lions members to assemble additional supplies during the quarter (26 members, 159 hours).
- The Silent Auction Team was present at the Pancake Breakfast with successful, fundraising results. And they have been busy procuring and collecting items for future events planned in the Spring (6 members, 90 hours).
- The City's annual Christmas Tree Lighting event in the City Hall parking lot was held on 12/4/23. It took 31 members to prepare and distribute 1,800 hot dogs to the assembled citizens (160 hours invested).
- The club's Christmas Party Committee provided a fabulous dinner and celebration for the attending members and their spouses on 12/5/23 (4 members, 40 hours).
- Lions Club members made up a combined total of 21 donors at the two Blood Drives on 10/21/23 & 12/16/23. Planning, advertising and supporting those two events involved 54 hours spent by Club members.


