Lifelong Friends Pet Adoption Center is our local *no kill pet shelter* located in Lago Vista that takes in stray and abandoned dogs and cats. There are about 10 full time and 20 part time volunteers who keep the shelter operating. The volunteers do a number of activities including walking dogs, feeding the animals, administering medications, cleaning their crates, fund raising, and helping with off-site pet adoptions.

Lifelong Friends is a 501 (c)(3) non-profit organization and has no funding support from government sources. The \$6 thousand monthly operating expenses and \$50 thousand annual veterinarian costs are funded totally through donations and adoption fees.
