Strides for Diabetes Awareness is a Llons sponsored community event that promotes recognizing and recording physical activity with the goal of increasing healthy levels. Let's get moving, Lago Lions and get the whole community up and at 'em, defeating Type 2 diabetes with our activity!

Visit our website HERE to download a convenient conversion chart to keep track of your daily activities converted to miles. Included are mileage numbers for some local places - Lowe's, Brookshire Brothers, Bar K Park, etc. If you don't have a Fitbit or other method of recording, ask Lion Susan Nilsson-Weiskott and she will happily measure activities that are not already included (including your home - housework takes more steps than you might think!). And remember those distances walking on the golf course! Invite others to participate, including family, visitors, fellow dog walkers, neighbors, whomever. Just ask them to record or offer to keep track as they report. When you are out and about, you might wear your Lions shirt - an opportunity to encourage others to participate and/or invite potential new members. Every mile, half, or quarter mile counts - they all add up to more than we might expect. And if you feel so inclined you might do a little more than you planned. After all, November and December are typically gorgeous months here and we can get away from our treadmills and stationary bikes to be outside. Message in a Bottle

The dynamic duo of Sue and Dick Weatherly have been burning it up with the new Message in a Bottle initiative. Motivated by the spate of poor health issues our club members confronted over the summer, Sue Weatherly took to the Internet to search for a viable solution that would provide first responders or concerned neighbors with a means of communicating with family members in the event of an emergency. She found it and in spades! And none other than a Lions

project in England! After adapting the project to the US market, Dick used his perseverance to come up with a multitude of community partners to provide the bottles (CVS and Brookshire Brother's Pharmacy), the labels & magnets (Vistago Print), printing of information sheets (City of Lago Vista) and the collaboration of the Police Department and ESD1.

The project now encompasses much more than the original motivation and will provide first responders with important medical information that has the potential to save lives.

The Message in a Bottle consists of one sheet of paper per home occupant which provides all the pertinent personal and medical information, plus contacts for family members or loved ones, whether pets are in the home and a photograph. It includes a red, medical alert magnet which informs he first responders that the lifesaving information is in the freezer! No need to go searching high and low...

Lions of Vibian Services

So far this fiscal year, 23 Lago Vista Lions have heeded Helen Keller's challenge to be "Knights of the Blind." We serve vision in three different ways, KidSight screening for school kids, Eyeglass Recycling to repurpose eyeglasses to help the needy and as donors to help needy kids whose parents can't afford a necessary exam and eyeglasses, the latter with our partners at Northshore Eye Care.

19 Lions who are certified users of our SPOT device participated in 13 events where we screened 2,500 kids and found 288 who needed to be referred to an eye doctor—a bit more than 10% of all the kids whose lives will be improved with better vision.

Now, 4 Lions are helping to collect eyeglasses for recycling to our center in Midland, where the glasses are cleaned, the prescriptions are read, and they are classified and ultimately are donated to groups who go on medical missions. We have collected 1,050 eyeglasses so far this year, and over 160,000 since we began keeping records. Every pair potentially improves the life of one person. We have also received recommendations for several kids in Lago Vista ISD who need help, but their parents cannot afford it, so we have referred them to our partners at North Shore Eyecare who have examined them and made them glasses paid for by the Lions.

Many thanks to the dedicated Lions who selflessly and continuously volunteer as Knights of the Blind...helping to protect and restore vision here and globally!


