The TLC Goal: to provide an atmosphere, wherein children who have physical disabilities will be allowed to achieve maximum personal growth and self-esteem.

The TLC Mission: to provide, at no charge, a camp for children from the State of Texas afflicted with physical disabilities, diabetes and cancer regardless of race, religion or national origin.

The "Dream" certainly became a reality as we all know. However, that dream could not continue without the dedicated Lions volunteering their time and effort to continue Jack Wiech's legacy.

Connie Zschoche was honored to present the prestigious Jack Wiech Award to Lion Jo Anne. She has aways helped in so many ways at the camp, our club, and at the district level. ### **O&Mathon**

In professions that support those with visual impairments, 0&M stands for Orientation and Mobility. Orientation and Mobility is provided to students with visual impairments for the purpose of empowering them with the knowledge, skills, and experiences needed to safely and efficiently move through a travel environment relevant to being active youths in preparation for adulthood. Saturday April 27th the Cedar Valley Middle School, Round Rock was host to the semi-annual "O&Mathon" – a day of "big-muscle" sporting events for children with visual impairments and their families. The O&Mathon began in 2006 with the goal of providing students with an opportunity to develop their travel skills through participation in sports and recreational activities. Three of our Lago Vista LEOs, Olivia Smith, Kaius Northcut, and Hailey Shirley and their advisors, Sara Bush, Norma Owen, and Bill Bush were on-hand as volunteers to help coordinate events such as sprint races, softball throw, soccer kick, t-ball hit, hole in one golf, bowling, basketball, beep baseball, obstacle course, blind fencing demonstrations and more! A key benefit for the LV LEO and Lion volunteers was learning from experts in the field how to best interact with the blind; how to help them "explore" their surroundings and to offer support in guiding without being invasive or over-bearing. The event provided first-hand experience in the importance of the Lion's mission of being "knights of the blind".




