Mike Elliott, our Tail Twister, brought us a most fascinating presentation on the Lions Drag Strip which operated in Wilmington County, adjacent to Long Beach in Los Angeles (hence the strip's nickname of "The Beach") from in 1955-1972. It was fascinating to learn how the founding of the drag strip helped to resolve the loss of



life from illegal street drag racing and how it grew in popularity and contributed to a robust subculture, being featured in many movies and popular television programs.

The Lions Automobilia Foundation and Museum was founded in December 2019 by Southern California businessman and car enthusiast, Rick Lorenzen. It's nearly 100,000 sq. ft. facility includes galleries featuring Southern California's infamous car culture and motorsports history.

At Lago Vista's National Night Out event on Oct. 7, 2025, the Lago Vista Lions and LEOs Clubs provided the community with helpful information about existing North Shore mental health resources and services. The service event was in support of Lions Clubs International's active focus on mental health through initiatives that promote awareness, education, and advocacy. It was part of the first Lions Week of Service for Mental Health and Well-being, which took place from October 4-12, 2025, coinciding with World Mental Health Day.

In addition to planning and preparing material for the National Night Out event, LV Lion President Norma Owen worked cooperatively with Tracie Thor, President of the Point Venture Lions Club, in planning and hosting an online Mental Health 1st Aid Training for the benefit of both club and community members. And in preparation for the National Night Out event, Lion Bill Bush met with Hope Center Director of Counseling Becky Bostic to learn more about the

many significant counseling services offered by the Hope Center of Lago Vista to youth, adults, and couples in our community. Becky is a Licensed Professional Counselor, MA, LPC. She provided printed copies of important material describing Hope Center Services for the Lions to distribute during the event. She also helped the Lions construct a North Shore Mental Health Resources Directory for the Lions to pass out as an aid to those seeking support. (Next Page)



I'm very excited the Lago Vista Lions Club's commitment to environmental stewardship has welcomed my project, Swim For The Reef, to be the November 18 Program Feature.



Here is a brief summary:

I produced the **Swim For The Reef** documentary-honored to be accredited and screened at the 2016 Cannes Film Festival as well as winning many additional Film Festival awards including Global Film Festival-Most Inspirational Short Film Award. I was humbled and blessed to be the Director, underwater cameraman (love the Divine gift of coral reefs), editor and composer for the documentary.

The documentary relates how a Texas grandfather's love for the oceans and his desire to save them for his grandchildren turned into an epic public awareness campaign and documentary film. The movie tells the story of Paul Ellis, who at age 61 attempted to swim the 40 miles across the Yucatan Channel and by doing so, acquire international attention to the issue of dying coral reefs. Not only does the documentary show that amazing accomplishments can be achieved at any age, it also highlights the many threats to the world's coral reefs and urges everyone to take action to protect them for the sake of the world we are handing to our next generations.

> "I see into their eyes and I see not just them, I see their children too and I want them to have a really nice life and I want them to see the coral reefs as vibrant and alive as they are today. Hopefully our mission will in some way, some small measure make it more possible for these wonderful people to have a better shot of seeing the wonders of the world that I've seen. 
